






# Training course for youth workers:

# "Why So Radical?" Preventing youth radicalization through historiccivic education



Vukovar, Croatia – 21/27 June 2022

#### TRAINING DESCRIPTION

The training "Why so radical?" deals with the issue of growing radicalization among European youth. In the training, we would like to use the word radicalization as an umbrella term, gathering different dimensions connected to the issue as hate speech, intolerance, revisionism and trivialization, racism and xenophobia, and discrimination based on perceived different ethnic belongings or sexual orientations.

During the training course, 26 **youth workers** will learn new non-formal methods, exchange good practices and acquire new skills from the historic and civic education fields, which will help them to deal with young people prone to radicalization in their local communities. The participants will discuss how to understand and explain complex processes and their causes and consequences to young people, improve critical thinking and active learning, introduce concepts as multiperspectivity, tolerance, and dialogue.

The training will take place from the 21<sup>st</sup> to the 27<sup>th</sup> of June 2022 in Vukovar, Croatia. Vukovar is a city in the eastern part of Croatia, whose population has been dramatically hurt during the war of the 1990s. Despite still being the scenario of divisions and confrontations, Vukovar is today also a stage for positive steps toward the research of a common dialogue and examples of good practices.

You can join the training course if:

- you are a youth worker, educator, or have an interest in youth work;
- you are over 18;
- if you are a national or are currently living in one of the following countries: Croatia, Greece, Italy, Slovenia, or Portugal.

#### **COSTS**

Traveling, accommodation, meals and all program activities during the Training Course are fully covered by the organizers.

#### **Travel costs**

The organizers will reimburse the travel costs based on the cheapest and closest to the venue possibilities (second class railway tickets, bus tickets, low-cost flights), accompanied by the receipt of complete and original tickets, invoices, bills, receipts, or boarding cards.

Before buying the tickets, please consult with the project's team and check the traveling route with them.

#### Check list for travel reimbursement:

#### 1. Regular plane tickets must be accompanied

- by the original invoice (signed and stamped)/receipt/pay order/proof of payment
- the **boarding pass** (the small ticket with QR code you receive before boarding the plane)
- the **prices** stated in the invoices, receipts etc. must **coincide** with the price on the ticket

#### 2. Electronic air tickets must be

- printed out and include your name, the exact fare you paid, details of your flight on the same page
- provided along with the credit card receipt for the payment or a copy of your bank statement (clearly showing the payment has been made)
- given in with the **boarding pass** (ticket with QR code)

**NOTES**: Some airlines print "passenger receipt" at the top of the cardboard ticket. It is not accepted as a receipt of proof of payment. Therefore, if you book your tickets online, please, make sure to print out the e-mail you receive from the airline company upon the payment, stating how much and how you paid. If you use an App for booking your plane, be sure to save or screenshot the boarding passes, as they disappear from the application after you have used them.

#### 3. Train/Bus tickets

• It is important that that arrival and departure time as well as the price are visible (+ invoices if available)

#### Other important details:

- · Missing or lost tickets are not reimbursed
- Booking paper alone is not enough
- Any costs for taxi are not reimbursed
- Return tickets must be bought in advance before the journey

The travel must take place on the direct way within **maximum 2 or 3 days** from the dates of beginning and ending of the Training Course. In case of long pauses or indirect routes (holiday travel), there is no reimbursement of travel costs.

## TRAVELING TO VUKOVAR

We would like to welcome you all on the **21st of June**, to start with the dinner and getting to know each other. Please plan your travel according this arrival time. In case of any problems or delays, please contact us.


By plane, you can fly to the Airport "Dr. Franjo Tuđman" in Zagreb. The Zagreb airport is connected to different European cities via the low-cost line Ryanair, you can check the routes on their site: Ryanair.com. For general research of the flight connections we recommend Skyscanner: <a href="https://www.skyscanner.net">https://www.skyscanner.net</a>. In alternative, you can check for flight connections from your home-countries to the airports in Ljubljana, Belgrade and Budapest.

If you arrive at the Zagreb Airport, you can find a shuttle bus from the Airport to the Central Bus Station. The buses are usually white, with the writing "Croatia Airlines" on the side. The Central Bus Station is the last station of the tour, the drive takes around 35 minutes. From **Zagreb Central bus station (Autobusni Kolodvor)**, it takes around 4/5 hours to get to Vukovar by bus. If you are planning to travel **by bus**, you can check the connections on Flixbus (<u>FlixBus</u>) or Zagreb bus station website (<u>Autobusni kolodvor Zagreb Home (akz.hr)</u>, or <u>getbybus.com</u>.

#### From Vukovar bus station to the accommodation

The accommodation is **Dom učenika Vukovar (Student house Vukovar), located in Ul. kralja Zvonimira 1**. To reach the accommodation from Vukovar bus station you have to reach the bus stop "Vukovar" (see map) and take the bus number 2909 in direction "Vinkovci". Your stop is "Vukovar – Borovo Naselje". From that stop, you can reach the accommodation by foot.

# ACCOMMODATION

The participants will stay in **Dom učenika Vukovar** (<u>dom-ucenika-vukovar.hr</u>), located in Ul. kralja Zvonimira 1, in 2 or 3 person same-sex bedrooms. Bed linen will be provided but please bring your own toiletries (towel, shampoo, etc.).
